Information on the processing of personal data carried out by the National Data Protection Commission (CNPD) for the management of applications to the RE.M.I. initiative

RE.M.I ("Regulation Meets Innovation") is a joint initiative of the CNPD and the AI Factory designed to foster a structured and constructive dialogue between AI and digital technology stakeholders, regulators, and subject-matter experts within Luxembourg. An application form is provided by the CNPD to allow potential stakeholders to express their interest in participating in the initiative.

1. <u>Data controller</u>

The CNPD is the controller of the personal data processed for the management of applications submitted via the dedicated form.

2. Purposes of the processing and legal basis for the processing

Applications submitted via the form are assessed by the CNPD together with the members of the AI Factory to select relevant stakeholders for the RE.M.I. initiative.

The form requires the interested companies to provide personal data concerning the staff members representing them. These personal data (related to professional activities) are necessary to carry out the selection process.

The implementation of the RE.M.I. initiative depends on the final adoption of the draft law 8476. This draft law designates the CNPD as the market surveillance authority in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg. As such, the CNPD will be competent to establish AI regulatory sandboxes and to launch related initiatives.

In this context, the processing of the personnel data listed below in point 3 is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest vested in the CNPD [Article 6, paragraph 1, point e) of the General Data Protection Regulation - GDPR].

3. Data subjects and personal data processed

The following categories of personal data are collected through the application form:

- Applicant's contact person: name, surname, position held in the organization, professional contact details (phone number and email address).
- ➤ Legal representative (if the application relates to a group of companies): name, surname, position held in the organization.
- Experts designated to attend the plenary and working groups: name, surname, organization and position held, field(s) of expertise, professional contact details (phone number and email address).
- Representative of the applicant: name, surname, signature, position held in the organization.

4. Categories of recipients of the personal data

Applications must be sent to the address <u>ia@cnpd.lu</u>, managed by the AI department of the CNPD.

Applications received by the AI department of the CNPD are then discussed and therefore shared to the AI Factory's partners involved in the selection process, namely:

5. Storage duration

Applications selected to participate in the RE.M.I initiative are kept for a period of 5 years. Applications that do not meet the conditions to participate will not be retained.

6. Rights of the data subject

If you belong to one of the categories of data subject mentioned in point 3 above, you have the right to access your personal data and to obtain a copy of them (Article 15 of the GDPR), to obtain the rectification of inaccurate or incomplete personal data (Article 16 of the GDPR), to object to the processing of your personal data under the conditions laid down in Article 21 of the GDPR, to obtain the erasure of your personal data under the conditions laid down in Article 17 of the GDPR, and to obtain the restriction of the processing under the conditions laid down in Article 18 of the GDPR.
